# FROM THE EDITOR



#### **Greetings Everyone!**

As mentioned last month Cathy and I attended Roundalab and the National in Iowa. It was for us a wonderful time to dance. In addition our presentation at Roundalab was well received and our new choreography presented at the National's Showcase of Rounds was a hit!

#### **National and Square Dancing Observations**

While wandering around the National, I had the opportunity to observe the square dancing. There was a smoothness, grace and fluidity to the dancers. It didn't matter what level the hall was. Dancers were ... well ... dancing. Somehow, it felt different than the dancing I've seen in recent years in Arkansas. I could not put my finger on why I had that impression, until I read and edited this month's article from J.K. Fancher.

Do you realize that we have been fooling ourselves and our callers have been allowing it? I'm sorry to say this, but the greatest majority of dancers and clubs in the state of Arkansas are NOT Plus level. Many are hardly able to dance Mainstream! In the "RUSH TO PLUS" we have bypassed the **FUN**-damentals of square dancing and as J.K. intimates, have lost possible dancers in the process.

#### Mainstream and Rhythm

Many of you do not know that at one time I was a Plus dancer and a very good one at that. Mainstream, DBD, All Position, Hot Hash, and the full Plus program were second nature to me. Dancing to the beat was automatic. I LOVED to Square Dance!

Why? Because the club I learned Plus from had one rule ... <u>Everyone</u> had to dance one year of Mainstream with their Mainstream Club BEFORE they could take Plus lessons. Because of that rule I became a better dancer. My Mainstream **FUN**-damentals were second nature to me. Truth be told ... Some of the best dancing I've ever done was not

Plus. It was to a caller who could turn a square upside down and inside out using Mainstream. In Arkansas today,  $\underline{if}$  you got the right square and the right caller, you would understand what I mean.

Was I upset that I could not learn Plus immediately after Mainstream? NO! I was dancing up a storm! Mainstream in that club was not looked down upon. Plus level dancers danced four nights a month (two nights of Mainstream and two Plus). It was the dancing that was the important thing! Not Plus!

There is enough blame to go around for the lack of dancing proficiency in Arkansas. Dancers and Clubs want to boast that they are Plus level and tell the callers to call "plus". Callers know that the dancers/club is not capable. Yet they don't argue. Unfortunately for dancing, callers are paid entertainers. They work with what they've got (workshop) and ... smile, shake their head, and carry on.

#### Let's get back to the FUN-damentals

Have we been chasing away new dancers by not allowing them the time to dance for the **FUN** of it? To be <u>successful</u> Dancers? Or have we been rushing to Plus and the work of learning Plus was not **FUN** anymore. Is that why so many new dancers never return?

Have experienced dancers left because they no longer can have **FUN** dancing a complete tip without it breaking down? Are we no longer dancing for the **FUN** of it?

Maybe it's time to return to being a Mainstream club ... OR ... maybe it's time to have an hour of pure Mainstream at the start of each dance. There is no dishonor in dancing any level. Why not let new dancers sharpen their skills before "cutting their teeth" on Plus? Let them dance for the **FUN** of it! Why not have "experienced" dancers warm up with mainstream at the start of each dance? For the **FUN** of it!

The **FUN** and <u>exhilaration</u> of Square Dancing comes from dancing a tip in a square that dances with grace and fluidity to the beat of the music without breaking down. I don't see much of that in Arkansas. Without returning to the FUN-damentals ...

You can't dance without being active!



# J. K. Fancher



#### **CALLERLAB**

Callerlab formally came into being in 1974. Early informal brainstorming meetings with five callers with vision were held in 1961. Ten years later the discussion group had grown to over fifteen veteran square dance callers. During that period Bob Osgood publisher and editor of *Sets In Order* magazine created the Gold Ribbon Committee with fifteen subcommittees involving over 200 square dance leaders to do an in depth study of the needs of the square dance community.

Armed with this plethora of information the organizers, now numbering twenty three callers met in semi-formal meetings in 1971. 1972 and 1973. That group invited approximately one hundred more callers and Callerlab was formally born in 1974 at its first convention in St. Louis, Missouri. I was invited to join Callerlab in 1975 and continue to be a member. I attended three of the annual conventions.

This month we will take a capsule look at Callerlab. Its beginnings, reason for being, some actions, accolades, criticisms, and impact on the square dance world. Subsequent articles will discuss the history of the organization as it evolved.

Callerlab accomplished exactly what it initially set out to do to address several needed reforms. It immediately developed a "standardized list" (actually very similar to the list we use today) of calls to be used on a trial basis. It slowed down the ridiculous deluge of new calls with even more ridiculous names that were being dumped upon dancers by the dozens each month. It standardized the definition of calls (movements) so that dancers across our land and foreign lands could dance to the same choreographic language.

It established a dance level system (Basic, Extended Basics,

Mainstream, Plus 1 and Plus 2, Advanced 1 and 2, and Challenge) consisting of several lists of calls of increasing complexity so that there was something for everyone, at least in theory. It put into effect a system for the selection of certain new calls to be used on a trial basis. This was accomplished by a quarterly selection mechanism that worked very well. This is only a short list of the total goals accomplished but includes the major goals and establishes the base for a beginning discussion.

The exploding square dance of that period (1975-1985) continued and with the new Callerlab watchdog. It produced a heavenly age for western style square dancers. There was something for everybody ... as long as it was not the mainstream program or below. People who wanted to learn square dancing couldn't get into classes fast enough. Both callers and dancers had a field day and lived it as if there was no tomorrow. It was Camelot. It was an era of good feeling. Life in the western square dance world just could not have been better. We all loved it and lived it fully.

And then, almost imperceptibly at first, like a whisper, wiser heads, even among those who had worked so hard to ensure a more disciplined dance system was established, began to warn us that we may have just begun to dance ourselves into a corner. Had we saddled our activity with an attitude like a boa constrictor that was beginning to squeeze the very life from our beloved dance activity?

Committees were formed. Studies were made. Editorials were written. Speeches were given. Callerlab programs became suspect. Programs ... why yes, maybe that was the cause. So it was that the concept of Callerlab programs would take the initial fall. Some said that the Callerlab programs had by mistake built in possibilities for failure. From the beginning, both callers and dancers (because callers told them so) decided that the lower programs, BASIC and EXTENDED BASICS, were inferior or for inferior dancers and that no self-respecting dancer would go to dances that offered only those programs. Even the Mainstream program was sometimes considered to be inferior and that the only way to go was Plus and above.

So a snooty caste system developed among dancers. No one wanted to dance the BASIC or EXTENDED BASICS program. And by that time no one wanted to dance pure Mainstream either because it had become the "in thing to dance a hybrid" of mainstream and some plus calls mixed in. Sound familiar? The Plus Program managed to remain mostly Plus even with the illegitimate child of Mainstream/Plus muddied up the waters. The combining of the Plus 1 and Plus 2 programs may have been a contributing factor.

And that was alright except when the hybrid dancers began to believe that they were Plus proficient and went to real Plus dances. There they really drew the ire of dancers who indeed knew the total Plus program and its disciplines.

The late Bob Osgood, the same Bob Osgood who was instrumental in creating Callerlab, and still one of the great square dance visionaries of all time, in the mid-1980s was one of the few voices crying in the wilderness, "Repent or be sorry." Osgood said it well in his "white paper" in 1985. He reminded us that we ALREADY HAD A SQUARE DANCE PROGRAM IN PLACE that should be considered.

He suggested that callers begin to create a following of dancers that would dance Basic as an end program and to simply call the dance "square dancing." Beginning dancers could learn to dance the program in three months or so. He even had the audacity to suggest that the Basic program should become the "most danced program in the nation." And only callers could make that happen. But callers weren't about to rock the boat. They now enjoyed the newly found status (probably unintentionally at first) of being a professional entertainer and the "more is better" movement continues to roll.

But no one listened. By 1990 the dance was on the threshold of free fall. Most callers and dancers alike were stricken with the Chicken Little syndrome, "Duh! The sky is falling," or "where did all the dancers go?"

Fast forward seven years. National caller, Jerry Junek, Callerlab Chairman in 1997 emphatically suggested that the body of Callerlab endorse the Basis Program as our entry level. That too fell upon deaf ears. By 2003 the Basic Program was no longer a Callerlab program. And then the surprise, or at least to me at that time, at the annual meeting in April 2006, Callerlab members voted to reestablish (subject to ratification by the members NOT PRESENT) the Basic Program (then the first 53 movements) of the Total mainstream list of 68 movements.

Callerlab even endorsed the Basic Program as a stand-alone program.

That idea like other proposed abbreviated entry-level or stand-alone ideas by Callerlab and other groups have never really succeeded in great numbers. I have reported on most of them during the past twenty-five years as they came along. Most have been some form of the old retail sales "bait and switch" gimmick ... "get 'em in door and then sell a higher price item" which equates to the "hook them with the 12-week entry program them sell the more is better ideology. Oh my! We have heard that before.

We are fortunate to have two professional caller organizations that serve us, Callerlab and the American Callers Association. They don't win all of the battles but they do win most of them.

Next time let's recognize some of the older clubs in the state. I know we have a couple of clubs in north Arkansas that have been around and danced an unbroken record of more than thirty years. What about the remainder of the state? My e-mail is down so write me a note or call me. Tell me the story of your club.

Until next time remember ... Dance often and with style!


