Square dancers keep twirling

Technology has changed the music, but not the dance

While a few square-dance callers have stayed loyal to turntables and 45s, Johnny Eubanks isn't among them.

He's still got a turntable that he sets up in front of Rattan Hall's stage, but only because the record player is part of the amplifier system. Square dancing is now a fusion of old dance and modern technology.

As the hobby wanes in the United States, worldwide people are learning how to swing their partners. It's especially big in Japan, dancer Ellen Ross said. In Japan, callers use exactly the same calls as their English-speaking counterparts, so dancers must learn at least that much English.

There was a time when Eubanks worked with five clubs in four states. He called square dances five nights a week in Arkansas, Oklahoma, Missouri and Kansas. He was also working full time with the Department of Defense.

"That got to be too much," he remembers, so he had to ask some of his clubs to find a new caller.

He recorded square dance CDs and 45s and still conducts weekend square dance festivals and workshops. He travels to other clubs to act as guest caller. One club will have to shut down temporarily while their caller recovers from an illness, he said. "It's a dying art," he said of calling.

Eubanks has called for the Kingsdale Squares for 38 years. None of the original members are still active. In fact, Eubanks doesn't believe any of them are still alive. The Bella Vista group, which started in 1976, has always been a club for retirees.

Eubanks had only been calling for two years when he started working with the Kingsdale Squares. He always had an interest in music. A co-worker at Fairchild Camera and Instrument Corp. got him interested in calling. He taught Eubanks the basics of square dance choreography.

Callers choreograph their own dances to their choice of music. Not all of them work with country music, Ross said. She's danced to opera and rock.

When he started choreographing, Eubanks used paper cups marked with B or G for gender, then moved them around a table top. After a few years, it got easier and he could picture how the dancers would come together without the cups. Callers often borrow moves from each other and that's fine, he said, because everyone is ready to help other callers.

The dancers don't realize how much work he does behind the scenes, he said.

Square dancing is a social event. Many people are in it for the camaraderie, he explained. It's a great way to learn social skills, he said, and that's something today's young people would benefit from.

There used to be clubs all over the area, he remembers, but now there are only two including one in Pex Ridge and one in New-

ark. The dancers are welcome at any of the clubs and they all know each other.

There are often a few singles attending the dances, Eubanks said. Some are widows or widowers of other dancers. They can always find a partner for at least some of the dances.

One way it is popular, Ross said, is to learn to dance as a man. There are only a few moves that are different for a woman and a man, and she knows them. When she's dancing as a man, she wears a hat and uses the first name "Allen."

There are several levels of expertise in square dancing, Eubanks said, and the Kingsdale Squares offer classes about every other year. It would be very difficult to start without the classes, he said. He begins each dance with a half-hour workshop so some of the less-experienced dancers can practice. It's also a chance for them to ask questions. There are a few difficult moves that he uses very sparingly. People want to come to the dances to have fun, not to feel like they can't keep up.

Eubanks usually has two easy "tips" and then one "plus-level tip." A tip is a dance to a specific song. By the time the third tip comes along, newbies are happy to sit down and catch their breath.

"I've never know who you're going to get," he said. "You need a happy medium... That's the challenge of the thing to work out routines that they all enjoy doing."

The Kingsdale Squares don't compete; they're too social for that, Mossy Owens said. She's only seen an adult competition once at a national convention. Most of the women members have a traditional full skirt, but they don't necessarily wear them to the Monday-night dances. When they do wear their skirts and petticoats, they probably twirl a little more, she conceded. You can buy square dance clothing online, she said.

There used to be a square dance store in Blanton, Sherry Barrett said, but it closed. She bought her full, richly detailed skirt from another square dancer. They've tried to interest younger people, according to Owens, a recent president of the club. They talked to some PE teachers and some homeschool parents. They would like to interest young parents as well as their children.

But meeting on Monday evenings isn't good for young families, she conceded.

"When you're retired, Mondays are like any other night," Barry Owens said.

When the Owens retired as club presidents, no one wanted the job. Start Allen explained, so they formed a board with four couples who share presidential duties. Among the duties is coordinating snacks for the dances, along with making sure a large pot of coffee is hot and fresh. They only do ball music on holidays, she said.

The club's 40th anniversary will be this fall. The board is planning something special. Eubanks plans to be there to call — just as he has for 38 years.

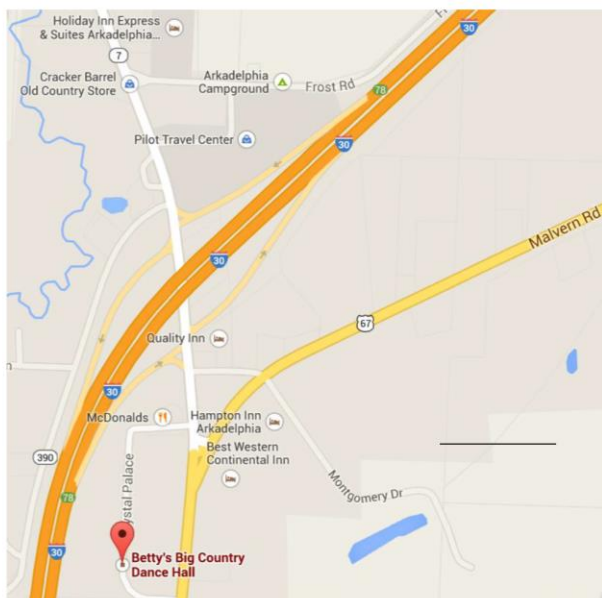

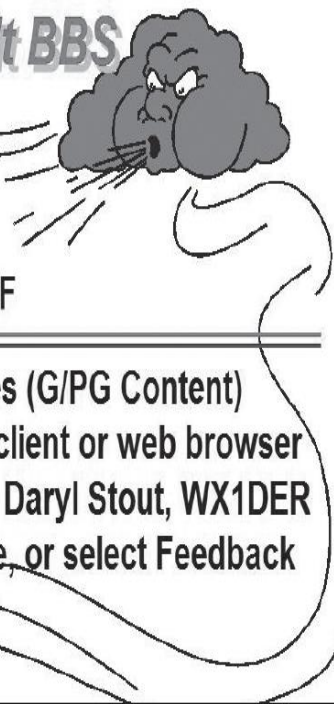

Square dancers keep twirling

Technology has changed the music, but not the dance

While a few square-dance callers have stayed loyal to turntables and 45s, Johnny Eubanks isn't among them.

He's still got a turntable that he sets up in front of Riordan Hall's stage, but only because the record player is part of the amplifier system. Square dancing is now a fusion of old dance and modern technology.

As the bobby waxes in the United States, worldwide people are learning how to swing their partners. It's especially big in Japan, dancer Ellen Ross said. In Japan, callers use exactly the same calls as their English-speaking counterparts, so dancers must learn at least that much English.

There was a time when Eubanks worked with five clubs in four states. He called square dances five nights a week in Arkansas, Oklahoma, Missouri and Kansas. He was also working full time with the Department of Defense.

"That got to be too much," he remembers, so he had to ask some of his clubs to find a new caller.

He recorded square dance CDs and 45s and still conducts weekend square dance festivals and workshops. He travels to other clubs to act as guest caller. One club will have to shut down temporarily while their caller recovers from an illness, he said.

"It's a dying art," he said of calling.

Eubanks has called for the Kingsdale Squares for 38 years. None of the original members are still active. In fact, Eubanks doesn't believe any of them are still alive. The Bella Vista group, which started in 1978, has always been a club for retirees.

Eubanks had only been calling for two years when he started working with the Kingsdale Squares. He always had an interest in music. A co-worker at Fairchild Camera and Instrument Corp. got him interested in calling. He taught Eubanks the basics of square dance choreography.

Callers choreograph their own dances to their choices of music. Not all of them work with country music, Ross said. She's danced to opera and rock.

When he started choreographing, Eubanks used paper cups marked with B or G for gender, then moved them around a table top. After a few years, it got easier and he could picture how the dances would come together without the cups. Callers often borrow moves from each other and that's fine, he said, because everyone is ready to help other callers.

The dancers don't realize how much work he does behind the scenes, he said.

Square dancing is a social event. Many people are in it for the camaraderie, he explained. It's a great way to learn social skills, he said, and that's something today's young people would benefit from.

There used to be clubs all over the area, he remembers, but now there are only a few including one in Pea Ridge and one in Neo-

sho. The dancers are welcome at any of the clubs and they all know each other.

There are often a few singles attending the dances. Eubanks said. Some are widows or widowers of other dancers. They can always find a partner for at least some of the dances.

One way to be popular, Ross said, is to learn to dance as a man. There are only a few moves that are different for a woman and a man, and she knows them. When she's dancing as a man, she wears a hat and uses the first name "Allen."

There are several levels of expertise in square dancing, Eubanks said, and the Kingsdale Squares offer classes about every other year. It would be very difficult to start without the classes, he said. He begins each dance with a half-hour workshop so some of the less-experienced dancers can practice. It's also a chance for them to ask questions.

There are a few difficult moves that he uses very sparingly. People want to come to the dance to have fun, not to feel like they can't keep up.

Eubanks usually has two easy "tips" and then one "plus-level tip." A tip is a dance to a specific song. By the time the third tip comes along, newbies are happy to sit down and catch their breath.

"You never know who you're going to get," he said. "You need a happy medium.... That's the challenge of the thing to work out routines that they all enjoy doing."

The Kingsdale Squares don't compete, they're too social for that, Maura Owens said. She's only seen an adult competition once at a national convention. Most of the women members have a traditional full skirt, but they don't necessarily wear them to the Monday-night dances. When they do wear their skirts and petticoats, they probably put a little more, she conceded. You can buy square dance clothing online, she said.

There used to be a square dance store in Branson. Sherry Barnett said, but it closed. She bought her full, richly detailed skirt from another square dancer.

They've tried to interest young people, according to Owens, a recent president of the club. They talked to some PE teachers and some homeschool parents. They would like to interest young parents as well as their children. But meeting on Monday evenings isn't good for young families, she conceded.

"When you're retired, Mondays are like any other night," Barry Owens said.

When the Owens retired as club presidents, no one wanted the job. Start Allen explained, so they formed a board with four couples who share presidential duties. Among the duties is coordinating snacks for the dancers, along with making sure a large pot of coffee is hot and fresh. They only do full meals on holidays, she said.

The club's 40th anniversary will be this fall. The board is planning something special, Eubanks plans to be there to call — just as he has for 38 years.
