

Education & Publicity

When we promote and sell square dancing to the outside world, we often focus on the social, and both physical and mental attributes of our activity. The long term effects of the physical aspects of exercise should not be overlooked when selling square dancing — even to the extent of the music we enjoy. "There's no question, anecdotally at least, that music has a very stimulating effect on physical activity" said David Tarsy, professor of neurology at Harvard Medical School. "And I think that applies to dance as well."

Millions of Americans dance, recreationally or professionally. How many of us who ballroom dance, break dance, round dance or square dance realize that we are doing something positive for our brains?

Older people who exercise in this manner end up with metabolic younger hearts, according to a study at Washington School of Medicine in St. Louis. By at least one metabolic measure, women benefit more than men from the training. Scientists have given little thought to the neurological effects of dance until rescently when researchers began to investigate the complex mental coordination that dancing requires. In a 2008 article in Scientific American. a Columbia University neuroscientist posited that synchronizing music and movement – such as square dancing - constitutes a 'pleasure double play." The music stimulates the brain's reward centers, while the dance activates its sensory and motor circuits.

Studies have further identified the brain regions that contribute to the learning and performing of square dancing. These brain regions include the motor cortex, somatosensory cortex, basal ganglia, and cerebellum. (Technical jargon ... sorry.)

The motor cortex is involved in the planning, control, and execution of voluntary movement. The somatosensory cortex, in the mid region of the

brain, is responsible for motor control and also plays a role in eye-hand coordination. The basal ganglia, a group of structures deep in the brain, works with other regions to smoothly coordinate movement, while the cerebellum integrates input from the brain and spinal cord and helps plan fine and complex motor actions.

While some imaging studies have shown which regions of the brain are activated by dancing, other studies have explored how the physical and expressive elements of dance actually alter brain functions. Much of the research on the physical activity associated with dance echoes findings on exercise, showing benefits that range from memory improvement to strengthening neural connections.

An earlier study in the New England Journal of Medicine by researchers showed that dancing can decidedly improve brain health. The study investigated the effect that leisure activities had on the risk of dementia in the elderly. The researchers looked at the impact of 11 different types of physical activity, including golf, swimming, and tennis, but found that only one – dance - lowered participants' risk of dementia. The combination of mental effort and social interaction made the difference, according to researchers.

Other studies have shown that dancing helps reduce stress, increases levels of the feel-good hormone serotonin, and helps develop new neural connections, especially in the regions involved in the executive function, long-term memory, and spatial recognition.

Additionally, dancing has been found to be to be therapeutic for patients with Parkinson's disease. More than one million people in this country are living with Parkinson's, with 60,000 new cases annually, according to the Parkinson's Disease Foundation,. Parkinson's belongs to a group of conditions called motor-system disorders, which develop when the dopamine-producing cells in the brain are lost. The chemical dopamine is an essential component of the brain's system for controlling movement and coordination.

Lastly, (Square) dancing can also be considered a form of rhythmic auditory stimulation (RAS). Studies of the effects of dancing have found significant improvements in gait and upper-extremity function.

Bottom line people 15 ways exercise can improve your health by square dancing.

History & Change

History is full of cycles. All dance forms have a history of rising from the ashes of a past form to crest and then fall again into near oblivion. The leaders and dancers in any given cycle put their own distinctive spin on the activity and for that moment in time believe that their ideas and the dance they support are not too be violated. Our current square dance cycle began just after the end of World War II (circa 1946).

The period from 1946 until 1986 witnessed a number of changes and drastically changed the face of square dancing. Those changes included: radical redo of the dress code; invention of the club concept; use of public address systems; explosion of new calls; development of singing

calls without a walk-thru first; new caller techniques; air-conditioned halls; snooty attitudes; choreography as a science; caller as a professional entertainer; the dynamics that spread modern western style square dance world-wide; the demographics that changed the average age of a dancer from thirty-five to sixty-five; just to name a few.

The advent of Callerlab in 1974 smoothed out the playing field and stabilized some bad practices. Despite all the good that Callerlab did establishing common sense practices, its critics claim they contributed to the free fall in the number of dancers by the mid-1990s. The sad truth was that most of the problems came about due to caller and dancer misuse of the Callerlab programs. They were created to provide a niche for all choreographic interests in the square dance world. Callers and dancers alike chose to modify the use of those programs. The organization of a second professional caller's organization in the early 1990s, while needed for a competitive balance, may have created some caller mistrust in caller and dancer ranks.

Since 1996 we have been at the bottom of our cycle. There has been little progress in the last twenty years and many are still resisting change.

Our present actions and upcoming changes to the Arkansas State Square Dance Federation (ASSDF) will be writing our (future) history:

- 1. Remember that your editor Fred Fisher brought the *Modern Square* into the digital era over six months ago. Subscribers can now read it in digital format around the middle of the month rather than the end as with the printed version. One big advantage ANY NUMBER OF DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPHS may be submitted and will be used in the **E-edition*. Plus if submit in color, THEY WILL BE APPEAR IN COLOR. This benefit alone could be our first itsy bitsy baby steps into social networking for square dancing in Arkansas. It doesn't cost anyone anything. Someone in one of the pics could easily be holding a poster with all kinds of information on it as a starter.
- 2. A Bylaws Review Committee is at work updating bylaws that were put in place when the Federation had an enormous dancer population (95 squares at the 1986 fall festival) and when Arkansas was subdivided into districts which had their own sets

of officers and special district dances under the overall banner of the ASSDF. If any reader has input, please contact Fisher now. Hopefully the proposed new bylaws will be complete and ready to be voted on at the Fall Festival Delegate's Meeting.

I keep screaming that we in the square dance world have got to make practical use of social media networking. We can make it work for the square dance community when we decide we want to. It's there (here) now. The problem is that we as a group have to get beyond the belief that it is idle and senseless nonsense. Information flows so effortlessly today. We need to utilize it. Send selfies of square dance activities! Text about the next square dance or lesson or event! Editor Fisher has offered us a painless way to start. We all need to start running with it!

I promised last time to re-visit the history of what has come to be known as the modern western style square dance. So along with timely topics we will be weaving a story (not necessarily in chronological order) that begins on the village greens of England and the British Isles during the 1400s, through English Elizabethan times, to France, back to England, the colonization period, west across America, and back east across America. We in Arkansas catch the movement going both ways.

So where will that history come from? Up until a few years ago it would have all come from the PRINTED PAGE and for all practical purposes it still does. But all of that is changing. More and more is being digitalized. The Lloyd Shaw Foundation was one of the first organizations to catch the digital wave of the future. However, most of the material I will use comes from, what I have always termed, my trusty time machine. That includes files of old square dance magazines, hooks, note services, and just about anything that has been printed for the past seventy-five years. And yes ... I will fill in the blanks from the internet.

Newcomers interested in square dance history should go to the internet. However, you will miss that nostalgic tactile feel of dusty musty old books or magazines that can be so enchanting as you travel back in time.

Square dance publications were initially established to announce where dances were being held. Later, additional information about dancers, clubs, etc. began to be added. Thus from a one page announcement, another page was added and a magazine was born. Yes, the *Modern*

Square was created by Lloyd and Hazel Wilson (president 1962) in 1962 for the same reason. The *Modern Square* has been published monthly since that date. Arkansas square dancers can be proud of that history. I have been a subscriber (since 1966) to Missouri's square dance magazine the *DOIN's*. That magazine went to an every other month publication several years ago as have other states. Sadly some states have even had to completely discontinue publication of their magazine. In Arkansas we have been close to a cease publication decision more than once.


