

Education & Publicity

One essential need of our square dance community is the constant selling of our activity. Promotion should not be limited to the one or two weeks prior to a new dance program (typically in the fall). Often promotion seems to fall on the shoulders of perhaps two or three of the more enthusiastic dancers. The problem is that they have hounded their friends and neighbors to the point of being a nuisance. Here is a good case for the new dancers to be tapped as recruiters. The new dancers are energetic and enthusiastic. They are not burned out and they are exposed to a different community or population that has not been exploited.

Materials and methods for new and old recruiters....

- ➤ Websites LiveLivelySquareDance.com You2candance USDA.org arts-dance.com (hopefully) your own club website. * Let the web sites do the selling for you.*
- ➤ **Business cards** are inexpensive, easy to create and carry around. Each club member should have a handful and be in the habit of exchange them at every checkout counter restaurant, grocery store, hardware store, sport shop etc. *Talk about exposure!*
- ➤ **Document** How did your new members find out about square dancing? What recruiting tool(s) are working for you?
- ➤ One on one communication *the ever popular word of mouth.*

There are different tools available that may be just as or more effective. In his seminars, Tim Marriner listed these marketing methods....

CD's or tapes Referrals

Flyers Special demonstrations or events

Advertisements in publications Festivals and Conventions

PowerPoint on laptops Newsletters

And the list can go on and on. Each of these methods can be expanded.

Thoughts & Musings

This will be a continuation of a series of articles that resulted from my end of year reflections regarding, what our square dance activity is all about, and, what we might do to catch a wave of attention that could kick start our activity into frenzy of growth similar to that experienced at the end of World War II. Some of my thoughts . . .

MUSIC & MP3

Today we live in a largely paperless society as a result of modern digital, electrical and mechanical technologies. Every aspect of our lives is co-mingled with those technologies. YES. Even our dance activity has not been immune to the digital pressures. **MUSIC**, the most important factor that drives our dance activity, was one of the first things that changed the way we perceive our digital society. That came as a result of commercial interests making music and motion pictures available to the average person on the street.

A compressed format, not the original digital space hogging high fidelity design which made data storage tortoise-slow and gobbled up storage capacities, was developed. We know this compressed format for music today as **MP3**. It transformed digital download speeds and storage considerations by a factor of 10:1. That kind of technology made it practical and relatively inexpensive for commercial interests to reap tremendous profits based on the ease and frequency of sale to the average music fan.

By 1995 the interest in digital music had spread to the internet. In the beginning bitter legal fights between several related entities ensued (remember Napster). As commercial interests jockeyed to gain superiority in the market place, music piracy, copyright infringement and file-sharing cases were all a part of the battle that continues on a lesser scale today.

How does MP3 audio compression work?

I spent a couple days trying to think of some way to describe the

process and then I saw it. It was right there before me all the time . . . a book shelf.

Let's set the scene. Assume we have a book shelf ten feet long. That's 120 inches. Let's further assume that it is filled with 120 one inch thick books and that each book weighs about 1 pound. Let's further assume that the subject of each book is square dancing and that some of the books present a more complete picture than others. Some present history. Some present various concepts. Some contain choreography. Some discuss dancer skills. Some deal with caller skills. All told, the 120 books tell the entire story of square dance complete with all the nuances involved.

Now let's begin at the left end moving to the right. Let's mark an "X" on every tenth book. We will now have marked 12 books. Now remove from the shelf 4 books on the left side and 5 books on the right side of the marked books. That's 12 x (4+5) or 108 books removed. That leaves only twelve books left standing on the shelf. Ninety percent (90% of 120 is 108) of the books are gone! Now push all of them together and they take up 12 inches of space and weigh 12 pounds instead of 120 pounds. That makes a small and light package and certainly easier to ship than a very large package weighing 120 pounds.

That's essentially what the MP3 process is all about. Ninety percent of the total audio frequencies in a selected audio piece of music are removed. This is accomplished by an orderly method know as an algorithm or a series of algorithms. The use of algorithms in MP3 creation is used to target, cancel, filter out, null out, or mask frequencies in the audio spectrum that (scientists or experts contend) can be deleted with little change in the resulting audio sound as perceived by the human ear.

Its actual use in square dance environment is probably not a problem when we consider the ambient noise in a square dance hall. {Editor's Note: It is also not a problem when one considers the callers misuse of the bass/treble controls and the overdriving of the music and their voice. Good sound has seldom been a part of square dancing.} Additionally, all the inner ear cilia damaged by loud music that kids or adults have subjected their ears to will also make listening to MP3 music a moot point anyway. Consider this look into MP3 music as information rather than a criticism.

SOCIAL MEDIA!

What are we going to do about the cyberspace billboard that boasts over 1.3 BILLION users on Facebook alone? We in the United States

rank eleventh in the world in the use of social media. Seventy-three percent of Americans use social media every day. The current population of the United States is 323 million. Anyway we look at the picture - it is enormous. **Any ideas out there?**

One a practical basis . . . I have found that when people are invited to respond to an opportunity through social media to become members of a civic club, church or a historical society . . . not one responded. NOT ONE! I do remember one instance several years ago when one national politician raised an enormous amount of money via social media. Others have had success. What are we missing?

OUR SQUARE DANCE ACTIVITY

By the middle 1980's leaders within the dance community were beginning to see, that cracks in the wall of our activity were about to break wide open and drown us in problems of our own making. Visionaries, such as Bob Osgood (publisher and editor of *Sets In Order*) and Stan Burdick (publisher and editor of *American Square Dance*) made valiant attempts to turn the movement around. At the same time a couple of professional organizations came into being (Callerlab in 1974 and American Callers Association in 1992) that began taking steps to refine and stabilize the square dance growth phenomenon that was running amok. By 1985 the numbers of dancers and clubs was beginning to decline despite efforts at revitalization. By 1995 the bubble had burst and we were at the bottom of a cycle.

Folks, we have languished there for twenty long years. Feeble attempts to rock our activity off dead center have failed.

Someone . . . some leader . . . some dancer . . . will have an idea that can, AND WILL, usher in the new "Camelot" of square dance. It could come from Arkansas.

Dance often and with style!




